Note:

In the event that a government either fails a vote of confidence or resigns prior to a fixed election date then following an Order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council an election would be held. The fixed election date would then be reset to commence on the legislated date four years following the declaration of a new government. As an example, provincially, the next scheduled election would fall on the first Monday of October, in the fourth calendar year following the most recent provincial general election.
