





I am pleased to present the report on the election of the members of the Legislative Assembly for the 67th General Assembly for Prince Edward Island.

I would first and foremost like to express my thanks to the election team, Deputy Chief Electoral Officer, Stephanie Thorpe, Manager of Election Operations and Communications, Paul Alan, Elections Office Coordinator, Gabrielle Anderson, office support team, Amir Sayafi, Kerri Jay and Chantia Sawyer, as well as the 27 Returning Officers, their Election Clerks, the hundreds of workers who worked at the polling locations Island wide, and the support of the Information Technology and Shared Services Department. Their dedication and professionalism were second to none, and they were all instrumental in the success of the 2023 General Election.



The fixed date for this election was legislated to be held on Monday October 3rd 2023. Our team in the office was in our election-ready mode starting in January to be prepared. We selected a date to be ready in case of an early election call. Since 1982 there have been 12 full General Provincial Elections held and 66% (8) of them have been in the Spring of the year.

With elections to be held every 4 years, and with the Spring of the year seeming to be a preferred time, Elections PEI has some Legislative recommendations that will be forwarded following the submission of this report.

I would like to thank all Islanders who stepped forward and exercised their free and democratic right to vote. As we see a downturn in the engagement of voters all over the world, I really encourage and challenge all eligible Island voters to get out to the polls. This is your opportunity to shape the way our Island is governed. We will continue to work to ensure that the public has the utmost trust in the Election office, process and vision.

ELECTION SUMMARY

2023 PROVINCIAL GENERAL ELECTION

The Chief Electoral Officer issued a Writ of Election on March 7, 2023, to the Returning Officers in the 27 electoral districts to conduct a Provincial General Election for Monday, April 3, 2023.

POLITICAL PARTIES

There were five political parties registered with Elections PEI with the issue of the Writ of Election. The registered political parties nominated the following number of candidates:

Green Party of PEI	25
Island Party of PEI	11
Liberal Party of PEI	25
New Democratic Party of PEI	27
Progressive Conservative Party of PEI	27

Four Independent Candidates registered with Elections PEI.

The 2023 Provincial General Election had a record number of 115 candidates registered by the close of Nomination Day on Friday, March 17, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.

RETURNING OFFICERS

There were nine new Returning Officer hired to fill vacancies in various districts. This was the first election under the amended *Election Act* (December 1, 2022) adjusting to recommendations sent by Elections PEI to the Legislative Assembly of PEI. Returning Officers no longer need to live within the district they are administering and their "right to vote" was restored.

CONFIRMATION

Elections PEI recommended to the Legislative Assembly of PEI to remove the requirement of a province-wide enumeration/confirmation. It was amended in the *Election Act* and allows the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer to conduct an enumeration/confirmation when and where it is considered necessary due to any population fluctuation within the districts.

As 2023 was an election year, and in anticipation of an early spring election call, Elections PEI launched a voter confirmation event throughout January, February and March of 2023. All registered electors were mailed an Election Registration Card. If all the information was correct on the card, i.e. their address and correct spelling of names, no further action was needed. However, if any information was incorrect, electors were instructed to call the Elections PEI Call Centre. Over 7,000 electors called to have their information corrected or to be added to the Voter Registry. Throughout the election period the population on the Register of Electors rose to 109,587 electors.



VOTER INFORMATION CARDS

Eligible electors in the Register of Electors had a Voter Information Card (VIC) mailed to them. The VIC contained the elector's name, address and supplied information on when and where to vote. Each VIC had a unique bar code specific for each individual elector. The VIC's were previously mailed as a package of Voter Cards to all electors registered at the one address. For the 2023 election, the envelopes were eliminated, and each registered elector was mailed their individual voter card. The Voter Cards were redesigned.





POLLING DAYS

Elections PEI set up one voting location per electoral district across PEI for the advance polling days. For the advance polls, 34,671 electors cast ballots across PEI.

On Ordinary Polling Day, 65 polling locations opened across PEI. There were 74,075 electors recorded as voted in the 2023 Provincial General Election of the 109,587 eligible electors registered with Elections PEI. The overall voter turnout was 68.5%, a decrease of 9.16% from 2019. There was increase of registered voters, with 2,478 new electors registered to vote.

MAIL IN BALLOT

Elections PEI reported an increase in Mail-in Ballot Applications for the 2023 election. Eligible electors were invited to fill out the application on the Elections PEI website beginning Wednesday March 8, 2023. The application process closed at 6 p.m. on Tuesday March 21, 2023. 1,074 applications were received and processed with Elections PEI. The ballots were sent via FedEx Express throughout PEI, across Canada along with many international destinations.

All Mail In Ballot kits came with a paid return envelope for FedEx Express to get the ballots back to the Elections PEI office as quickly and securely as possible. The deadline to have the ballots returned to be included in the count was 12 p.m. on April 3, 2023. Elections PEI received 928 ballots back in the required time, an 86% return rate.






HIGHEST VOTER TURNOUT AGE DEMOGRAPHIC - DISTRICT COMPARISON


DISTRICT 4 CANDIDATE POPULAR VOTE TOTALS




DISTRICT 4 PERCENTAGE OF VOTES

DISTRICT 4 VOTED BY AGE DEMOGRAPHIC









STUDENT VOTE

CIVIX is a non-partisan, national registered charity dedicated to building the skills and habits of active and informed citizenship among young Canadians. CIVIX has been delivering Student Vote programs for federal, provincial, territorial and local elections across Canada since 2003. Elections PEI has assisted CIVIX in the past and yet again for the 2023 Provincial General Election. By supplying office space for organizing the PEI event and a cash donation, Elections PEI and Civix helped more than 6,000 elementary and secondary school students participate in Student Vote PEI.

After learning about government and democracy, researching the parties and platforms, and debating the province's future, students cast their ballots for the official candidates running in their school's electoral district.

As of 6:00pm April 3rd, 2023, 6,010 votes were reported from 32 schools, with results from 25 of 27 electoral districts. Ties were recorded in Alberton-Bloomfield and Evangeline-Miscouche.

- The **PC Party** took 43.7% of the popular vote and won 17 seats, forming a majority government. **Dennis King** won his seat in Brackley-Hunter River.
- The **Green Party** will form the official opposition with 4 seats. The Greens won 27.0% of the popular vote overall. **Peter Bevan-Baker** won his seat in New Haven-Rocky Point.
- The **Liberal Party** took 15.1% of the popular vote and won 1 seat. **Sharon Cameron** lost her seat in New Haven-Rocky Point.
- The **NDP** took 12.1% of the popular vote and won 1 seat. **Michelle Neill** lost her seat in Charlottetown-Brighton.
- The **Island Party** took 1.6% of the popular vote but did not win any seats. **Ahava Kálnássy de Kálnás** lost her seat in Souris-Elmira.
