Candidate Nominations Have Closed
Charlottetown, PEI, Friday, March 17, 2023

The window for nominated candidates to become officially registered candidates with Elections PEI for the April 3rd Provincial General Election, closed today at 2 p.m. The nomination process began on Tuesday March 7th, 2023, the morning following the issue of the Writ of Election. Nominated candidates from the five registered political parties and independents were given ten days to become a registered candidate with Elections PEI.

Tim Garrity, CEO of Elections PEI explains "In order for a candidate to be able to publicly campaign with advertising and or fund raise they must first be officially registered with the Elections PEI Returning Officer in their district". Garrity adds "The nominations have now closed as of 2 p.m. this Friday March 17th and a Grant of Poll is being issued in each of the 27 electoral districts to conduct a provincial general election on April 3, 2023."

This provincial election has candidates registered from the five registered parties along with some independent candidates. There are a total of 119 candidates on the ballot this April 3rd.

Green Party of PEI: 25 candidates Island Party of PEI: 11 candidates Liberal Party of PEI: 25 candidates NDP of PEI: 27 candidates PC Party of PEI: 27 candidates Independents: 4 candidates

Voter Information Cards are being delivered to registered voters with Elections PEI. Advance voting days are Saturday March 25th, Monday March 27th, and Friday March 31st. Election Day is Monday April 3rd. Polling stations will be open for voting 9 a.m. until 7 p.m. If you do not receive your Voter Information card in the mail, but you are eligible to vote, you can get registered at your polling location with the proper identification.
