



CHAPTER P-10

PLEBISCITES ACT

1. The Lieutenant Governor in Council may from time to time direct that Authorization to a provincial plebiscite be had and taken on such date as may be appointed to ascertain the approval or otherwise by a majority of persons qualified to vote thereat as hereinafter provided, of any Act of the Legislature or any part thereof, or of any order in council made pursuant to any such enactment, or on any question of enforcement of any such enactment.

- (2) Without prejudice to subsection (1), where it appears to the Idem Lieutenant Governor in Council that an expression of opinion of the voters is desirable on any matter of public concern, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may direct that a plebiscite on that matter be conducted under this Act. R.S.P.E.I. 1974, Cap. P-8, s.2; 1991, c.32, s.1.
- 2. (1) Unless otherwise directed by order in council ordering the issue of voter, the writ for the taking of the vote, at such plebiscite each person qualifications of qualified to vote at a provincial election shall be entitled to cast one ballot only, that is to say in the electoral district in which such person resides.

(2) Where the question or questions to be submitted relates to or Limitation on who affects only a limited economic group or class or to limited groups or classes, the order in council may limit the vote to such limited groups or classes and in such case shall determine the qualifications of the voters entitled to vote thereunder. R.S.P.E.I. 1974, Cap. P-8, s.3.

The Lieutenant Governor in Council may make regulations not Regulations inconsistent with this Act for the proper carrying out of its provisions and particularly for regulating the procedure prior to, at, and after voting, the advertising of the taking of the vote, the publication and dissemination of literature pertaining to the matters to be voted upon, the procedure as to recount and such other matters as may be considered advisable. R.S.P.E.I. 1974, Cap. P-8, s.6.

CHAPTER P-10

PLEBISCITES ACT

PROPORTIONAL SYSTEM REGULATIONS

(Approved by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated 18 October 2005.)

Pursuant to section 5 of the Plebiscites Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. P-10, Council made the following regulations:

1. This regulation applies to the plebiscite, to be held on November 28, Application 2005, concerning a mixed member proportional system for the election of the members of the Legislative Assembly. (EC567/05)

2. An elector shall indicate his or her approval or disapproval in respect Plebiscite question of the plebiscite by answering the following question:

"Should Prince Edward Island change to the Mixed Member Proportional System as presented by the Commission on PEI's Electoral Future?" (EC567/05)

- 3. The ballot paper for the plebiscite shall be in the form set out in the Ballot paper Schedule to these regulations. (EC567/05)
- 4. The Chief Electoral Officer shall have the conduct and supervision of Chief Electoral the plebiscite and shall have the power and duties of the Chief Electoral Officer under the Election Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-1.1. (EC567/05)
- 5. Confirmation of electors shall not be carried out for the purpose of the Confirmation of plebiscite. (EC567/05)

6. (1) There shall be no official list of electors for the plebiscite.

No official list of

- (2) A person is an elector in respect of the plebiscite, and subject to Electors these regulations, is entitled to vote at the plebiscite, if the person
 - (a) is 18 years of age, or will attain that age on or before November 28, 2005;
 - (b) is a Canadian citizen; and
 - (c) has been ordinarily resident in the province since April 30, 2005.
- (3) The following persons are not electors in respect of the plebiscite Persons not eligible and are not entitled to vote at the plebiscite:

as electors

- (a) the Chief Electoral Officer;
- (b) the returning officer for each electoral district. (EC567/05)

- 7. (1) A deputy returning officer at a polling station shall ensure that an elector is asked the following questions, and an elector shall answer the following questions, before the elector is given a ballot paper:
 - (a) "Are you 18 years of age, or will you attain that age on or before November 28, 2005?";
 - (b) "Are you a Canadian citizen?";
 - (c) "Have you been ordinarily resident in the province since April 30, 2005?";
 - (d) "Have you voted in any other poll in this plebiscite?";
 - (e) "What is your full name and full civic address?".

Entry of answers in the poll book

- (2) If the elector answers "yes" to subsection (1)(a), (b) and (c), and "no" to subsection (1)(d), the deputy returning officer at a polling station shall ensure that a poll clerk
 - (a) enters the full name and full civic address of the elector in the poll book; and
 - (b) asks the elector to sign the poll book to indicate that the information given is true and accurate.

Refusal to sign poll book

(3) Where an elector refuses to sign the poll book, he or she shall not be permitted to vote and the deputy returning officer shall ensure that the refusal is noted in the poll book opposite the name of the elector. (EC567/05)

Polling stations

 - (a) two polling stations in electoral districts 1, 4, 7, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 24, 25, 26 and 27; and
 - (b) three polling stations in electoral districts 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, 11, 17, 18 and 23.

Idem

(2) One of the polling stations in electoral district 11 shall be established at the University of Prince Edward Island. (EC567/05)

The Commission on Prince Edward Island's Electoral Future recommended the above plebiscite question on August 11, 2005.

An Order of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council approved the question on October 18, 2005.

An Order of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated October 26, 2005 approved the definition of "majority" thresholds as follows:

- (i) At least 60% of the valid votes cast province wide would need to approve the proposal; and
- (ii) At least 50% of the valid votes cast in at least 60% (16) of the province's 27 electoral districts would need to approve the proposal.

To notify the electorate on particulars about the Mixed Member Proportional System Plebiscite the Elections P.E.I. office placed a total of 26 ads throughout Island newspapers: Guardian (eight), Journal-Pioneer, Eastern Graphic, Western Graphic and the La Voix Acadienne.

The Elections P.E.I. website contained a variety of Plebiscite-related information, as well as a search engine to allow voters to locate their polling station locations. The website allowed Elections P.E.I. to post poll-by-poll results live as reported from the polling stations across the Island.

During the month of November, 2005, the Elections P.E.I. website served 322,843 pages of information. Of those, 134,121 (41%) were on Plebiscite day. Over 3.6GB of data was used on Plebiscite night to deliver results information to readers.
